The European Mobility Week campaign is an opportunity to present mobility alternatives to citizens, to explain the challenges that cities and towns are facing in order to cause behavioural change and make progress towards creating a better transport strategy for Europe. Since 2002, European Mobility Week has tried to affect mobility and urban transport issues, as well as improve the

health and quality of life of citizens. The campaign also gives citizens the chance to explore what the role of city streets really is, and to explore solutions to face urban challenges, such as air pollution.

Our school, having understood how important the goal of European Mobility Week is, decided to take part. The eventsthat our town organized lasted two, whole days. On the first day, a group of third grade students, accompanied by Mr. Sioutas, went to the hill of Prophet Helias. There wereother students from other schools there as well. They were all given t-shirts from the Mobility Week organization to wear. The experts talked to the students. They explained how to orientate in a forest and in a


Mobile phones

2nd year STUDENTS'TRIP TO THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM IN THESSALONIKI AND THE WHITE TOWER

Our trip to Thessaloniki was amazing. Our first stop was at the Archaeological Museum . The central rooms hold exhibits from the archaeological excavations conducted in Thessaloniki and the broader area of Macedonia. We were given a very interesting tour of the exhibits of the museum by a guide, who answered to all our queries. Our next stop was at the White Tower. The White Tower is a monument and museum situated in the centre of the city, looking over the sea. After being separated into small groups, we entered the six floor building. Climbing the large circular staircase, we stopped at each floor and observed the exhibits in the galleries..

Each floor has a central circular chamber, which communicates with the other smaller rooms, withopenings on the outer walls.

The last floor has only a central chamber, but there is also an outdoor area which offers great view of the city and the sea.
